

Overview

The Huggard Centre Supports individuals who are experiencing homelessness in Cardiff, they have been supporting people in Cardiff for more than 30 years

The doors of their Intervention Centre open at 8.30am every day of the year to day visitors. They are people who're sleeping rough and either don't have support from other organisations.

Thanks to Fareshare we can prepare hot meals for our clients every day. They enjoy all the food, and it is great they get to have a choice of fresh, quality home cooked food. 
